

# Emergency Medical Response (EMR)

This competency-based course prepares students in the core skills needed for a career in the EMS industry. They will receive basic Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) knowledge and manipulative skills as a result of hands-on training which can lead to further advanced training and certification opportunities. Characteristics such as honesty, integrity, responsibility will be emphasized. Students in this course will learn EMR skills such as: first responder well-being, legal and ethical issues, lifting and moving patients, patient assessment, medical emergencies, EMS system and operations, special patient considerations, and managing multi-casualty incidents. Students who complete the EMR program will receive an American Heart Association CPR card and ASHI (American Health & Safety Institute) certificate.

This course is designed for students who are pursuing a career in medicine and/or public services. Students pursuing a career in Fire Technology are highly recommended to also complete this course to meet the professional requirements preferred by current industry partners.

## Field Trips

Students in this course may participate in field trips to see first-hand what a career in the EMS industry requires and how to best prepare themselves.
