Pharmacy Technician Course



- Earn a program certificate
- Prepare for the board exam
- Gain leadership fundamentals and customer service skills
- Eligible to apply for a Pharmacy Technician license

Students will prepare to work under the supervision and direction of a pharmacy supervisor, or staff pharmacist. They will learn to keep records of drugs, drug distribution, intravenous (sterile compounding), compounding (non-sterile), pharmaceutical mathematics, pharmacy law, keyboarding, inpatient pharmacy, basic pharmacology, presentation and leadership fundamentals, care and maintenance of equipment and supplies. Students successfully completing this Pharmacy Technician course will be able to pass the PTCB exam and apply for a Pharmacy Technician license.

Prerequisite: Must have a high school diploma or GED and PTE assessment with a score in reading and math at the 8.0 grade level.

Cost: \$1825 per quarter (total cost of course is \$3,650)

Additional costs: \$300 for books, lab coat, and testing fee

Payment: Students must pay for class using a credit card/ debit card

Checks or cash are not accepted for payment.

Duration of the course: 2 quarters of Lecture and Lab (10 hours/week) totaling 207.5 hours
1 quarter of externship (120 hours).
= Total of 327.5 hours

Requirement: Must maintain a "B" or better grade in the first 2-quarters to be eligible for externship.
