About Mission Valley ROP Mission Valley ROP (MVROP) is a provider of career technical training for high-tech, high demand professions. In existence for over forty years, MVROP has been instrumental in preparing students for successful business, medical, and technical careers. Operating under a partnership with the Fremont, New Haven, and Newark Unified School Districts, nearly 4,000 students (adult and high school) participate each year in MVROP's exemplary Career Technical Education (CTE) programs.

Mission Valley ROP's dedicated staff, superior learning environment, and industry standard equipment all contribute to the exemplary success rate of our students. Keeping current with today's standards is critical, and we continually seek input from business and industry leaders who serve on advisory committees for each of our programs. All MVROP instructors are experienced in their field as well as credentialed by the California Commission on Teaching Credentialing. Mission Valley ROP provides the opportunity for students within the community to explore their professional interests in various career pathways through MVROP's in-demand CTE programs available at every high school campus throughout our partnering school districts and at our Center Campus.

The Mission Valley ROP Career Technical Training Center, also known as the MVROP Center Campus, is a 45,000 square foot, two-story building consisting of 19 classrooms, including four state-of-the-art biotechnology and health science labs, six cutting-edge computer labs, a fire garage and turn-out room, automotive maintenance and auto body garages, a suite of administrative offices, a Board Room, a Student Services Center, a Student Registration Office, a Staff Lounge and a Student Lounge.

At Mission Valley ROP, we believe in one common objective: inspiring and enabling our students to reach their full potential.

MVROP Program Information Mission Valley ROP provides a leadership role in improving and enhancing Career Technical Education programs in local high schools and the community by offering over 100 sections in nine career pathway areas of study. The nine pathways consist of:

- Arts, Media, and Entertainment
- Building and Construction Trades
- Engineering and Architecture
- Health Science and Medical Technology
- Hospitality, Tourism, and Recreation
- Information and Communication Technologies
- Marketing, Sales, and Service
- Public Services
- Transportation

Many of these course offerings include additional benefits including: UC "a-g" credit, college articulation, and internships.

According to the Longitudinal Study Technical Report completed by the School Improvement Research Group (SIRG) of UC Riverside, it has been documented that:

- ROP students earn higher wages than comparison group peers.
- ROP students have more success in securing raises and promotions on the job.
- ROP students enroll in post-secondary education in large numbers.
- ROP students have better 12th grade attendance rates.
- ROP students improved their high school grade point averages as they progressed from 10th to 12th grade.

While attending classes at the Center Campus, students from all three districts are given the opportunity to learn hands-on skills, collaborate, and flourish with like-minded individuals who are pursuing their career pathway of choice. Every MVROP program imbeds the Expected School-wide Learning Results or "ESLR's" in the course curriculum to firmly connect the materials to the skills required by business and industry employers.

"Expected School-wide Learning Results" (ESLRs)

Upon successful completion of MVROP courses and programs, each student will demonstrate:

1. Workplace Basic Skills and Behaviors

- Apply skills learned in class
- Analyze information and make decisions
- Communicate verbally and in writing
- Work independently and as a team member in a diverse workplace
- Work reliably, responsibly, and ethically

2. Career Technical Skills

- Demonstrate occupational competencies
- Use appropriate technology
- Understand and practice occupational safety standards
- Demonstrate an awareness of how a business or industry functions

3. Job Employment Skills

- Develop a plan to achieve career goals
- Use effective job search strategies
- Demonstrate an awareness of the importance of lifelong learning

Adult Programs Mission Valley ROP offers adult programs which have been identified as sustainable career paths according to EDD Labor Market Information. These programs are offered at a lower cost and on shorter timeframes in order to best train and prepare our adult students for the next phase in their careers.
