Course Description:

Health and Medical Careers is a Career Technical Education (CTE) course supported by Mission Valley ROP (MVROP). Mission Valley ROP serves schools in Fremont Unified, Newark Unified and New Haven Unified school districts. This specific course is held at James Logan High School. It is a one-hour course that introduces students to a variety of health related careers and provides the education and skills foundation needed for entry-level positions in the medical field.

Throughout the course, students will learn about and have exposure to many career options. Integrated throughout this course are career preparation standards, which include workplace basic skills and behaviors, career technical skills, and job employment skills.

Course Objectives:

Students will be able to:

- Identify Different careers, research on various careers
- Describe various health careers and qualifying requirements
- Demonstrate professional qualities of a health care worker
- State basic legal and ethical responsibilities in health care
- Identify basic medical terminology
- Identity anatomy and physiology functions of the human body systems
- Identify sexual harassment and child abuse laws
- Identify appropriate nutrition and related diets
- Demonstrate proper infection control techniques, appropriate use of PPE
- Describe Microbe forms and types.
- Identify first aid procedures BLS/CPR techniques.
- Complete a Career Portfolio

Articulation: This course is articulated with Chabot College. Students who earn a B or better in the Health and Medical Careers course will be eligible for 1.5 college credits for HLTH 40: Introduction to Health Professions.

Assignments will be posted on Google Classroom. Assignments must be completed and submitted by the deadline to receive full credit.

- All assignments are due on the day announced. Late material will not be accepted unless there is an excused absence.
- All make-up work must be turned in within a week of returning to class. It is the student's responsibility to find out what material was missed during an absence and to make it up. For example, copy the notes from a classmate, check the bulletin board or web site (google classroom) for missed assignments, and check the file box for missed assignments.

Class Policies

- Participation/Attendance: Students are expected to attend and participate in class every
 day. If you are tardy or miss class multiple times, your grade will be adversely affected.
 Points for class participation are also dependent on the presence and punctuality of the
 student. Any absences or tardies will have a negative effect on job readiness and thus on
 the student's grade.
- 2. Missed Work: It is the student's responsibility to obtain any notes, handouts and assignments that were missed for an excused absence. If class was missed for a school function (i.e. athletic contest, field trip) it is the student's responsibility to see the teacher prior to the event to make arrangements for the missed work. If arrangements have not been made prior to the event, no make-up work will be allowed. All make-up work must be completed within one week of the absence. A student may NOT make-up any assignment, quiz or test due to an unexcused absence or tardy.
- 3. **Work Readiness:** You will be graded on your work readiness. Work readiness relates to skills that employers want to see in their employees and contributes to your formative grade. The qualities include: punctuality, attendance, assignments that are neat, complete, on-time and accurate, initiative and proper use of cell phones
- 4. Behavior: This is a career technical class; therefore we will adhere to a professional environment in the classroom.
